IN PASSING

Harold Plotnick (1925-1995)

Harold Plotnick, M.D. died May 25, 1995, from cancer at his home in Franklin, Michigan. Dr. Plotnick was born in Detroit, Michigan, in 1925, the youngest of five children. He received an undergraduate degree from Dartmouth College and an M.D. degree from Wayne State University. He did his internship at the Jewish Hospital and his residency at the General Hospital, both in Cincinnati. Dr. Plotnick was a clinical professor of dermatology at Wayne State University's School of Medicine. He maintained a successful private practice in dermatology in Detroit for 37 years. He was a charter member of the Noah Worcester Dermatological Society, serving both as secretary-treasurer for five years and then president of that organization in 1978. He was also a member of the American Academy of Dermatology and on its board of directors from 1984 until 1988. He was past president of the Michigan Dermatological Society and a member of the American Dermatological Association.

Dr. Plotnick authored numerous scholarly papers and book chapters, and was a nationally and internationally recognized expert in occupational dermatology. Even though he lived and practiced in Detroit, Dr. Plotnick came to many of our Chicago Dermatological Society meetings. He was friendly and warm and always made younger members feel welcome at these meetings.

Survivors include his wife Evelyn, daughters Beth Singman and Sharon Starr, son Dr. Adam Plotnick, and a granddaughter.

Harold Thatcher (1908-1995)

Harold Wendell Thatcher, M.D. died on October 6, 1995, at his home in the Kenwood neighborhood of Chicago. Dr. Thatcher had practiced dermatology on the South Side since 1939 with his partner and mentor, the late Theodore K. Lawless, M.D.

Dr. Thatcher received his bachelor and medical degrees from the University of Minnesota. He studied dermatology at the University of Chicago and Bellevue Hospital in New York. In World War II, he was a lieutenant colonel in the Army Medical Corps. He was chief of the medical service at the Army regional hospital in Huachuca, Arizona, and a recipient of the Legion of Merit.

In a 1976 Chicago Tribune interview, Dr. Thatcher spoke of Dr. Lawless, who had died five years earlier. "Dr. Lawless," he said, "was a doctor in the old sense of the word. He dealt in humanity. The more people he could treat, the more he felt he had accomplished." These principles applied to the way Dr. Thatcher practiced as well. When doctors were charging \$15, he was charging \$3. He saw patients from many ethnic backgrounds; sixteen hour days were the norm. "I'm not anything special," he added. "I just had a good teacher."

Survivors of Dr. Thatcher include his wife, Marjorie; his son, Peter Simon; and a grandson.

Loyola University

Brian Nickoloff, M.D., has recently decided to relocate his dermatopathology practice and research activities to Loyola University in Maywood, Illinois. Dr. Nickoloff previously was Director of Dermatopathology at Stanford University. For the past nine years, he had been at The University of Michigan where he was Director of the Immunohistochemistry Laboratory, Associate Professor of Pathology and Dermatology, and Scientific Director of the Cutaneous Oncology Program in the Cancer Center.

At Loyola University he plans to focus his full-time research efforts on his continuing NIH funded grants involving studies of psoriasis and Kaposi's sarcoma. He is primarily concentrating on clinically-based research activities, and would appreciate referrals of patients with these skin conditions who would be willing to have either punch biopsies or keratome samples of skin removed for research purposes. Dr. Nickoloff recently presented The Allan Lorincz Lecture at the last Chicago Dermatological Society on October 17, 1995, entitled "Role of Cell Survival Gene Products in Psoriasis," and plans to be an active participant in this Society.

- B. Patients aged 3 to 17 years of age with atopic dermatitis may be eligible for an exciting new study to evaluate use of a non-steroidal ointment for treatment of atopic dermatitis (topical FK506, the agent used to prevent kidney transplant rejection).
- C. There are also a number of other studies for patients from age 6 months to adult with mild to moderate atopic dermatitis.

All patients will be referred back to their primary doctor after completion of any studies.
